

Are you serious about sustainability in your feed milling operation?



The 2019 Asian Feed Miller Sustainability Award will recognise the livestock feed producer in South East and South Asia judged to have made the greatest progress towards sustainability in their operations in the previous 12 months.

To be eligible feedmills will need to hold the relevant licenses, certificates and permits; demonstrate that they understand the environmental, social and economic impacts of their operations; and have a sourcing assessment policy when making specific sustainability claims for product.

The winner will travel to Europe to meet with European sustainability experts at the German headquarters and production facilities of award sponsor, Addcon, and at a feed-industry related exhibition.

A panel of competent and independent judges from Asia and Europe will review the performance of nominated feedmills to assess practices that embrace sustainability.

Sustainable feed milling in South and South East Asia



Charoen Pokphand Group has been in partnerships with AG Processing Inc, the world's biggest soybean processing cooperative from the US, to develop a sustainable soybean meal supply. Somchai Kungsamutr, President and CEO of CP Group's Feed Ingredients Trading Business (fourth from left) said the partnership is aimed to develop a process where soybean meal can be traced back throughout the entire the supply chain. The project will develop international standard measures and regulatory guidelines on labour and human rights which will apply to all its supply chain and will comply with the laws of the countries where both parties conduct their business.

GreenFeed Vietnam Corporation builds all of its feedmills to rely on renewable energy to reduce cost and environmentally friendly. For example, it uses agricultural by-products such as rice husks, cashew nut husks and straws to fuel boilers that generate steam for conditioning and pelleting the feed.



Aiming to optimise the quality of corn for sustainable use, **Biotech Farms** in the Philippines installed a mechanical corn drying facility at its feed plant. With the facility in place, corn is properly dried, resulting a better-quality whilst the level of mycotoxins minimised. The company also invested in a grain management system that monitors and regulate the moisture content in the silo. This further enhances the corn quality during storage.

Cargill's feedmill in Port Klang, Malaysia uses natural gas for better sustainability and efficiency. A recently installed dryer maximises extruder capacity by allowing for natural gas to be supplied directly to the dryer, heating the air for better drying of the feed.



Judging criteria for the 2019 Asian Feed Miller Sustainability Award

To be eligible feedmills will need to hold the relevant licenses, certificates and permits; demonstrate that they understand the environmental, social and economic impacts of their operations; and have a sourcing assessment policy when making specific sustainability claims for product.

Assessment Criteria

1. General requirements

To ensure that feed manufacturers hold the relevant licenses, certificates and permits.

2. Manufacturing process

To ensure that feed manufacturers understand the environmental, social and economic impacts of their operations and take appropriate action to mitigate any associated negative outcomes.

3. Sourcing of ingredients & product claims

To ensure feed manufacturers are sourcing sustainable feed materials and are engaged with their suppliers on these issues.

Entrants will complete a template that explains the assessment criteria and support this with relevant documents.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

The Asian Feed Miller Sustainability Award is organised by Asian Feed Magazine, 25 International Business Park #02-103, Singapore 609916. Applicants must be based in South or South East Asia. The winner will be provided with two return economy air tickets from their closest international airport to attend a global feed or animal husbandry show as selected by the organisers, ground transport to and from the event and accommodation for a maximum of five nights. The prize is not transferable without the prior agreement of the organisers. Applications must be lodged by the close of business on 31 May 2019. The winner will be announced Broiler Feed Quality Conference in Bangkok on 21-22 August 2019 and published in the October/November 2019 issue of Asian Feed Magazine. The award is judged by an independent panel of industry professionals. Candidates will be judged solely on the published criteria. The decision of the judges shall be final, and no correspondence will be entered into.
